





Travel Guidelines for Health-Care Workers Only

Atlantic Provinces and specific areas in Quebec*	Self monitor	 Remain out of the workplace for 14 days following return to New Brunswick
Outside of the Atlantic Provinces and specific areas in Quebec*	Sentinel Swab Day 5Continue to workSelf monitor	 Remain out of the workplace for 14 days following return to New Brunswick Swab required on day 10
Outside of Canada	 Day 1 testing done as per federal requirements followed by sentinel testing done on Day 5 and Day 10 with negative test required prior to return to the workplace Continue to work between Day 1 and Day 10 as long as test results are negative If not immediate return to the workplace, negative testing done 24 hours prior to first return to work date and subsequent testing as required by Employee Health & Wellness 	 Remain out of the workplace for 14 days following return to New Brunswick Swab required on day 10

Outside of the Atlantic Provinces and Specific Areas in Quebec (see above *)

- Agree to testing upon return to the workplace with notification to Employee Health and Wellness regarding tests
- Health-care workers are responsible to book their own swabs: COVID-19 Testing and Tracing

Outside of Canada

- Health-care workers must have approval from manager
- Must have applied for ArriveCan travel registration
- Must provide EM/ANB Employee Health & Wellness with documentation of vaccination status
- Agree to testing upon return to the workplace with notification to Employee Health & Wellness regarding tests
- Health-care workers are responsible to book their own swabs: COVID-19 Testing and Tracing
